We will demonstrate our solutions and share knowledge in a training facility in Tanzania. We cooperate with a local partner in setting up a production and training center, a demonstration broiler farm, and a demonstration layer farm, both with a capacity of 2500 birds. In addition to training staff to manage these farms, we are going to provide veterinarian services, training to farmers and other trainers. For this purpose, we develop tailor-made curricula and manuals. Next to technical and farm management issues, we will pay close attention to food safety and animal health aspects. As the training facility can accommodate large groups of participants this allows us to also serve other regions, such as the Dar es Salaam region.

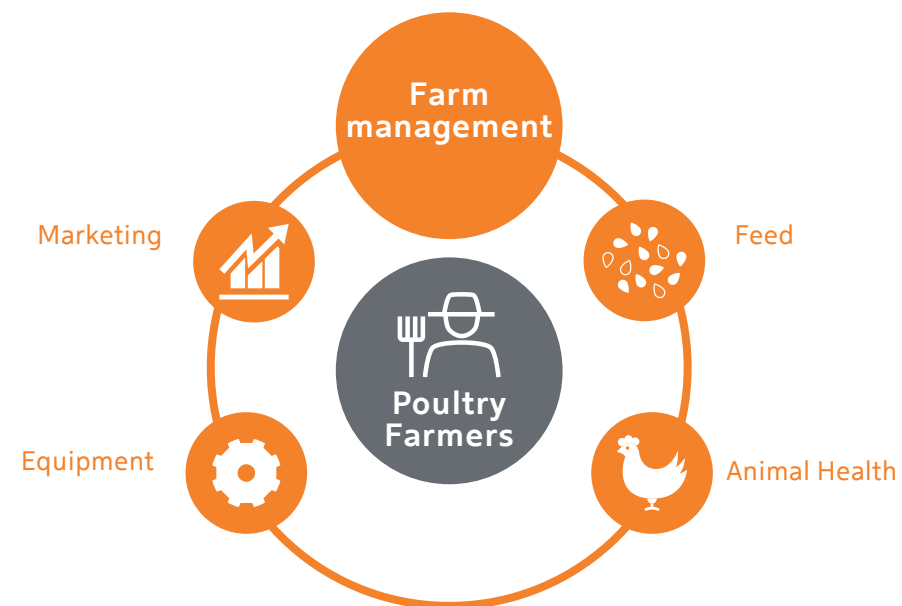
Sustainable Poultry Sector Best Practices in Tanzania
